## PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICAL APPLICATION

The Word will constructively build up the "new man" and on the other hand it will cause self-hardening to those who rebel against the living and active Word of God.

The Israelites hardened their hearts and refused to believe-missing both the earthly and heavenly Canaan rest. We the readers have been evangelized like Israel was. It did not benefit them due to unbelief. One author wrote, Will we repeat their folly and not let the Word mix with faith in our hearts through the preaching of the gospel?

The Word is like a surgeon's instrument that goes down in the darkness of the lungs and clearly exposes all that is there to be found. It identifies what is good and bad. Be honest with yourself about your relationship with God.
